

Act on the implementation of the results of research work in the educational process **Budapest Metropolitan University, Hungary**

We hereby confirm that the results of research work under grant AP14869297 on the title: "Priorities and mechanisms for overcoming unequal access of rural women of Kazakhstan to resources", developed by PhD, Associate Professor Anel A. Kireyeva, were introduced on January 15, 2023, to May 30, 2023, in the educational process of Budapest Metropolitan University (Hungary, Budapest).

Brief summary: the aim of the project is to develop conceptual provisions for improving the quality of life of rural women based on the study of theories, models and modern approaches to gender equality, to assess the level of access to natural, social, economic and digital resources in rural areas of Kazakhstan. This study is aimed at reducing poverty in the regions of Kazakhstan by developing mechanisms to overcome the unequal access of rural women to natural, social, economic and digital resources.

Scientific and technological needs: analytical materials on the developed author's methodology are presented, as well as a comprehensive index of gender differences is proposed. In addition, strategic directions for the development of the potential of rural women of Kazakhstan for strategic planning and implementation of programs are proposed. The planned research will contribute to the reduction of gender inequality by working on norms and standards, data and information, strategic dialogues, capacity development, knowledge and technology, partnership and education.

Social demand: This study is aimed at overcoming barriers to women's employment in the rural labour markets, which will make it possible to stop the practice of employment in informal, low-status and low-paid jobs without legal and social protection. The results obtained represent an original approach to the study of gender inequality problems on the example of a country with a developing economy, and ways to reduce it are proposed.

Conclusions and suggestions: the results of research work on the developed author's methodology and the comprehensive index of gender differences are of great scientific interest. Also, the research results are of practical interest to the educational process of students, undergraduates and PhD students of the university studying various aspects of the territorial development of countries, social, economic and innovative inequality.
